**The meeting was called to order at 11:40 a.m. by Chairperson, Paula Rabidoux**

**Agenda Item 1. Paul Jarvis/Data Research Project**

Paul Jarvis periodically attends other program committees on council to discuss and look for input to assist with creating data that would not only be helpful, but impactful to the work that council is performing. Once the idea is selected, the implementation of the work and activity will be the responsibility of Paul's research grant. But the type of grant need will come from the suggestion from one of the committees, which is why he was attending Outreach committee today.

As we discussed ideas in outreach, some of the questions were, what are council's barriers? Are there other disability and policy initiatives we should be exploring? Are there internal mechanisms we should be tweeting to become more effective council? Are there present initiatives we should be more of a participating advocate?

One such idea that was discussed was in the area of Health Literacy. Making it more understandable.

Health Literacy is the degree to which individuals have the capacity to obtain, process, and understand basic health information and services needed to make appropriate health decisions. Health Literacy is dependent on individual and systemic factors of communication skills of lay person and professionals.

Another potential research project is looking at Health outcomes, and how we measure the successes or failures of how we provide services.

Another thought from the group was the effectiveness of Telemedicine and how it is being received in the communities, patients, and the Medical Professionals.

Cassandra Archie's presentation dealt with the National presentation at the American Public Health National Conference, Denver, Colorado on Triple Jeopardy.
