Agenda Item ~1 -Pat Hicks Presentation

Dr. Hicks presented on the new Outreach Evaluation Project that looked specifically measuring the impact of the Ohio DD Council's outreach initiatives.

To identify the outcomes that had been achieved from 2002-2016 with the focus on outreach to unserved/underserved individuals with developmental disabilities and their families in 10 targeted grants. It will also define operational best practices, Benchmark ODDC to other state councils, and how to best move forward.

The report will illustrate the path that the outreach committee developed and pursued over the years. The unserved/underserved mandate of the DD Act, the inclusion of groups that in previous history of council (2002) had never participated in council activities, priorities, strategies, and approaches to reaching out to minority groups, and the utilization of grantees in our outreach efforts.

A critical piece of the report is the allocation process to all Standing Committees

Establishing unserved/underserved groups to work be side mainstream advocates in council and the community will clearly add education concerning Cultural Competence.

Agenda Item ~2- Action Item --- Cassandra Archie's Presentation—

Cassandra presented and summarized her proposal on sustaining the Triple Jeopardy Network through Digital Technology.

The impact that technology touches more than 50,000,000 individuals with disabilities in the United States.

The implication is profound.

Findings and purposes, Assistive Technology Act of 1998.

Digital Citizenship Training is designed to build the skills and knowledge of individuals to become safe and responsible digital citizens. The training will be implemented for a year.

The technology survey among the Women in the Triple Jeopardy network found that less than 15% had access to, or used technology.

The Outreach committee voted to accept the proposal of \$30,000 and to bring to Full Council tomorrow for a vote.
